Kwakha Indvodza is deeply saddened and concerned about the recent reports of child kidnappings, abuse, and killings in Eswatini. We strongly condemn these acts of violence and call on all members of society to rise and protect our children. Every child deserves to grow up safe, loved and free from fear. What we are seeing today is not just heartbreaking, it is a crisis. No child should be taken, harmed, or killed. As a nation, we must say enough is enough. As an organisation that works with boys and men to build safer and more respectful communities, we believe this violence is a clear sign that urgent action is needed. We must work together - parents, teachers, leaders, government, churches, and communities, to keep our children safe.

We call for:

- Swift justice for offenders
- More public education on child safety and reporting abuse
- The active involvement of boys and men in ending these incidences

This is not just a problem for families, it is a national emergency. Children are the future of our beloved Kingdom. If we cannot keep them safe, we risk losing more than lives - we lose our hope. Kwakha Indvodza will continue to use its voice, platforms, and programmes to raise awareness, support families, and work with all partners to ensure that every child in Eswatini is safe.
